 and Miss Caroline also, please tell Atterway that John
 thinks he is too old to go with her, and do not wish enough
 at this time, if he times and can go with the rest of the peo-
 ple next fall he will go then the servants all desire lots
 of love to Atterway and Tom with kindest regards for you
 and yours I remain your friend Susan A Goodwin
