Dear Doctor - Prior to the last arrival
of the "Palmer" on the coast, being
apprehensive that it was too late in
the season to admit of our collecting
a cargo for her, we decided to
hold our own Oil and other produce
and to ship it on a/c Hall & Co
for their a/c risk & benefit. —

We were forced to sell a few thousand
gallons for ready money, yet we
believe that the entire quantity is not
far short of 15,000 Gall — We
should have shipped also our Camwood
on the same account — We should
have put both at the market price
say 15,000 Gall Oil @ 60¢ 6000.00
50 Ton Wood @ 60 3000.00
\$ 9000.00

We are not in arrears in our
general accounts, beyond \$1000 —
and have funds to our Cr in the
N. State \$2600 —

Our object was to load your
vessel with dispatch, to give you
our Oil upon which a profit could
