Unless I misapprehend the facts of the case, there ought to be no objection to the demand made by the Liberian Government, so far as it concerns the giving ~~that~~ Government, a detailed account of all expenses incurred by our Society, in sending to Liberia the rescripted Africans, in the three vessels named in the official correspondence. —

But if the Liberian Government should go further, & say that the expenditures by our Agents were greater than they ought to have been, & call upon our Society to pay the difference between what those expenditures ought to have been & what they were; then I should say, that while the matter was
