wishing to disappoint her, & believing there will be
no difficulty from what I have learned from
her, in getting the amt of \$1000 for her passage, I
have taken her draft on her former Mistress
Mrs. Perneer, & I enclose you for the amt
which you will find here with enclosed. It seems
that some considerable monies & other property
has been bequeath to this young woman & her
relatives by her former Master at his death,
& she has been sent for to get it, should
the amt of her draft not be paid, please
inform me of it.

I have delivered to Mr. Rowson the Bill of Miss Park
& Bill of John, also his Bill of John & Co. He has
paid me the \$100. & I have also delivered to
Mrs. R. Hill. the 2 Bills of John & Co. the box sent
for her. Mr. Hill reflects to send you order
on me for the Bill of Park to his wife, but as
you as well as her have written me about
it, I deliver her the Bill of Park without the
order. I presume there will be no difficulty
about it, she needed it very much & I did
not like to refuse her, because
of his request to send her the order. There was
no surplus part of the ship's stores with which
to make these cases, & I have delivered of the same
to her. Since the arrival of the ship I have
had so much to attend to, that I have not been
able to make any regular acct with the
ship to send you. I have some matters of
charge against the ship, but will send you
herewith the full acct I have received for
passage monies & please my acct acct
to the ship to be settled hereafter. I will forward
