 rders. There is a young man on board - one of  
 the emigrants who came out in the ship  
 this time - who returns in the ship to wait and  
 attend on Mr. Gurley. He goes at the request of Mr  
 Gurley with the full consent of his parents.  
 Mr. Gurley assumes all responsibility in regard to  
 his returning in the ship & I think gave as-  
 surances to his parents to provide for him  
 while in America & secure a passage for him  
 back to Liberia. Mr. Gurley's position with the  
 society caused me to assent to his arrangements  
 in the matter. We were all glad to see & welcome  
 him; and have endeavored to make his visit pleasant to him.
