

and the balance 100 to 150 a C. Palmas.

We shall want the ship to stop at Monrovia long enough to get Dennis aboard.

If any body writes to us for a passage home, we shall turn them over to you as you suggest in your letter to Mr Copping. We have already received pay for one — who was expected this time.

We expect about 100 emigrants to reach Baltimore the 13 or 14 April.
