As the "Golconda" is to take on board emigrants at Savannah, the new flag will be very appropriate, for the independence of Liberia has been annually celebrated in Savannah.

John Lassen was offered forty dollars a month to go as steward to Havana, but his impaired health led him to decline it. He is now quite smart and has accepted a situation as companion for a young man of wealth in poor health at \$40. per month, with frequent opportunities to visit his family.

Will you send me a copy of the printed rules for the emigrants on ship-board? Did you find white sailors better than black ones? Letters from Africa complain of articles being stolen on ship-board. Our President (E. K. Price Esq) asks why African coffee cannot be used for the emigrants?
