Got Norfolk Va. 27 May 1857

My Dear Sir

No Sir, she has not come yet — and we have no consolation to day — or that she cannot come! She has a strong wind — dead ahead.

I have examined that barrel they left in the warehouse here, last Dec. The barrel seems to be full of hickory nuts — & the keg of red ochre — I shall, unless you order otherwise, put them aboard the Mary Caroline Stevens when she arrives at this port.

I received Telegraph yesterday P.M. from Malden that fifteen more people were coming to embark, & expect them here this evening — so that we shall have, all told 222, aboard.
