Your account of Expenses for Holcomb is quite satisfactory & also Mer de Lyon. I return it with a check for Balance \$12.50 - & will be obliged to you to send it home receipted in full as a Voucher for Treasurer.

I wrote yesterday relative to the claims in Liberia. You understood me & offered to do that was right, but Washington's letter and some misgiving, as to McGill's zeal led me to defer a little. I will however devote all that comes from Jordan & Roberts claims to liquidation of that long over due debt. Any payments of this year are already made and on their way unless James was disappointed. What shall I say about freight. I want it to
