Dear Sir your favor of 12/ult<sup>o</sup> was duly received this morning & acknowledging the receipt of the draft of \$2, & gratified are we to think all our dealing so far has been satisfactory, & for the following reasons must beg. you another favor on the first June I received a letter from a colored man in Liberia with a request to his sister to send by the M<sup>r</sup> Stevens a Bedstead & Key to fit it at the time the letter was received it was supposed the Stevens had sailed & so day on reporting the departing of the Sch<sup>r</sup> spoken of in yours & hoping it may not leave at the appointed time a friend of the ~~Person~~ in Liberia has placed in my hands the enclosed eight dollars & requests that you will please buy a Bedstead & Key for 700 dollars & have it marked James W. Wilson. Robertsport Cape Mount Liberia & forward the same by the sch<sup>r</sup> if possible if not hold the money subject to draft of C. Johnson or myself & retain the dollar for expenses. you will greatly oblige by using your judgement in the selecting the of the Bedstead Truly Yrs Henry P. Williams
