My Dear Sir

Yours of the 27th is received with
its inclosures.

We sent 207 — viz 142 adults —
55 children — & 10 infants — equal
to 169 full passengers —

We have received freight \$629.63
and there was one bill at Norfolk to be
paid in Liberia — but I have not a copy
of Bids & can only estimate roughly say \$75.00.
The empb. did not have half the bulk to which
they are entitled. — We have \$1000.00
passage of R. M. D. A. Nelson —

I infer that you do not want
to pay the additional \$3.000 tomorrow
or the day following — so I prefer to
let it remain to my credit in Bank
till after quarter day, the 1st — then
I will pay up. — I hope you will get to
the end of ships bills soon!

I stick up the notice of that
new firm — in which you are interested.
