Sir you will Remember
that I wrote to you last April. about going
to Siberia, I then desired to know if we
could be landed at Cape Palmer, where
our Relations are. and you informed me
that ^{we} should. and that you do for the Weaver
& seven part. families. of which we are a part
as you would for the emigrants direct from
Md. and if I make up my mind to go. to let
you know in time. with a list of the family
there are four of us. Myself wife and son. and
daughter. but I am not very certain that my
son. will go. but I am inclined to think he
will. when he sees that we are determined
to go. I am making every effort to go and
I think I shall effect my purpose. and
I would like to be in Baltimore about two
weeks before starting. as I have some relatives
in the city. I hope there will no hindrance
you will please Reply to this as soon as you
possibly can. also let me here how many
you expect to send out. and what time the
Vessel will start or sail
