Wash. City, 10 Sept. 1857

My Dear Sir

Yours of yesterday is received. We
have little freight - probably we may make
out the bulk of 100 to 150 bbls. - besides our
own provisions supplies & two cottages.
I do not think we shall have more
than the equal of 100 full passengers.
I have recd. a letter from Mr. Williams
wanting Cabin passage for self & wife.
I told him he could have it - a state room
for \$200.00. - I did want to send half
a doz. barrels - but now it is so near
our ships time, I shall wait for her. - I
have directed the alteration in the
advertisements which you suggest.
And now I do not think of any
thing more - & in fact I feel so "un-
satisfactory" - with our present prospects
& general surrounding - means & ends -
that I am not worth much. - Says will
continue Carysburg. - We are getting no
money - No. 1 emits - has lost the Tidemill
Case - Dr. S. is failing - &
