Dear Sir,

I regret of four of the  
10<sup>th</sup> too late to communicate  
your message in regard to the  
Piano, which I regret. The piano  
and a Melodion for Rev. Mr. Stokes'  
Church, as I understand, with  
other freight and baggage, are  
on the way to Baltimore  
by ship. Please see that they  
are not put on board till you  
hear from me again; for I fear  
I shall not get Mr. Howland off  
in time. A fourth rate lawyer  
is troubling him by suits for  
debt, and he has actually been  
in jail since Monday, unknown  
to his numerous friends. I have  
got him out, and have come
