My Dear Sir

Yours of the 8th with its inclosures
 is received. I am at a loss to understand
 the conduct of the Union Bank. If I had sent
 my Bank Book I asked them to settle up
 I wonder if they would not have been obliged
 to show their hand! I am sorry to have
 given you the trouble about it. I will write
 them the next time.

The footings you send to day do not
 quite agree with the footings of a/c's of V.
 B. & C. & of other matters, sent Dec^r though
 the results are the same. The final footings
 of those a/c's seem not to have been copied
 so you may not remember them. By
 them all I understood that we owe you
 on ship a/c. & outside a/c. \$1,486.90. In the
 a/c. of yesterday you charge us additional
 \$121.50, so that we owe you in all \$1,608.40 —
 that \$185.09 which you owe me, & \$23.50 which
 you G. W. S. Th. owe me \$208.59, deducted from
 \$1,608.40 leaves \$1,399.81, which I will send
 you next week — & then all accounts
 will be balanced say to 1 Jan, 1858.
