We have already the prospect of 21  
emigrants for May 1. And we shall  
not want any more unless we  
can get more money than we have  
the prospect of at present —  
In making <sup>up</sup> our accounts,  
I am at a loss how much to charge  
the Md. Soc. for voyage B. I cannot  
find the data — We sent some English to  
C. Palmas — Did you send provisions for them?  
Please say how much we may charge for  
said voyage B. —
