Dear Sir,

Jasper Bush Esq. of Clay Ashland Liberia, informs me by letter rec^d. yesterday that he has directed to my care a small box, which he ship'd on the M. C. Stevens to Mrs. Sarah Bell of Norfolk Va. This is to request you to send said box to Norfolk, where Mrs. Bell lives, and to the care of Mr. Lowell. Freight Agent for the Baltimore Steam Packets. and send with it a bill of the freight & charges on said box.

Should there happen to be found on the M. C. Stevens a package, or box, or bag of any thing, whatever, directed to me from Liberia, — please send it by the freight Steamers from Baltimore to Richmond, care of Ludlam & Watson — with a bill of freight charges &c. in —

Did the Stevens return undamaged by storms, &c.? Will she be repaired and ready for her spring voyage by the 1st of May?
