My Dear Sir

"Isaac Churchill, Norfolk, Va." says,
Chas. Cooper writes me that he sends me
in the M.C. Stevens a box of wine. Please
forward it to me — if marked or consigned
to me — or to Messrs. Galt & Co. if sent to them.
Send bill of expenses & I will attend to it."
He says he wants to send some freight in the
ship. I have written him that it must be
along side in Balt. by the 26th inst.

I have notified our emps. that
they must all be in Balt. by the 30th
inst. — that we will not go to Norfolk.
and so forth. A hard business it has been
& will be to justify it to our people —

One great trouble in bringing our people
to Balt. is a place for them to stay! At Norfolk
it is far better — & far less expensive.

I telegraphed you today — & I think
now that I shall not see you before next
week. I perceive that you are considerably
disgruntled — so I think I had better
stay away. — Dr. Cullam has been here
today & said you were well & full of cheer!
But I do not so read you.
