honored sir I received your letter dated April 21
I in this letter 3 dollars to pay for the box
that is mark Wm Schuner part of the freightage
that was destine for Liberia and Mr Drayton
at the time was absent from the city in
the country and he left in the hands of
Mr Joseph Michael six dollars to pay
the freight on the box that is marked
and snow and Wm Schurmer that money
was to pay freightage from Baltimore to
Liberia as far as it would go -
I have made a mistake when I said
4 dollars it was six ^{and} dollars that Mr Drayton
enclose in the letter honored sir I would be
be extremely oblige to you if there should be
any expedition betwix the city of Baltimore
and Liberia during the space of a week or so
I would be very glad for you send them on for
me if it be possible there is in the few pieces
of cold clothing and some new faces together
with meets and so on which may get spoil therefore
I am intereste concerning the meet that is so confine
and as the is so many strangers in the country I would be
very happy if you could get them off I will let the things
remain a month and Mr Drayton box like wis can remain
