I stated to the people of Utica that the Methodist Episcopal Church had its missionaries sent out and cared for by the Col. Soc. This gave some offence & Dr. Durbin in reply says they sent out Phillip Coker & young Burns.

I would like to know the particulars if there are any. Do if you have time send me a list of all their colored missionaries as far as you & George recollect.

Did you compel the M. Ep. Mission to pay for Coker or did they pay only part?

I wrote you yesterday about the oil warmer says 4 casks are very fine worth 10. ct. I wrote to him that he should hardly get 8½ ct & that on long time.

Family away, will be home to-morrow. Glad that George got his vessel home so quick, Hope she has made a good voyage.
