help to do it. I have no idea what a small
seine such as I wish to send will cost - I
shall enclose \$10. But if that is not enough
will send on what you will inform me
it is soon as I get the direction from you.
Some months ago I found a letter which had
lain long at the Court House with an order
for the expense of a box of Arrow root
being brought on to me from one of my
people in Liberia. I mislaid the letter
and could not recollect the Agents name
who dated from near Norfolk, perhaps
Hampton. As your name, which I cannot
forget, was associated with his I sent the
money for a letter to you which I will
thank you to let me know if it has been
safely received. - I should have written
to my good friends Mr. McLain or Mr. Gwolley
but thought as you were on the spot you
could get some one to get the seine and
have it packed, and directed to Anderson
Drown, & Henry Blake, carpenter in
Buchanan Bassa^c Liberia Africa
