I have not seen the original

We hope to get the ship loaded
 within the time allowed in the charter party
 viz 30 days & that she may be got off by the
 last of next week. It will much facilitate
 our operations to have all outstanding business
 of the ship settled early in the week.

May I therefore urge you to have that quantity
 of food, medical stores, as soon as convenient -

I would also like the advance of one hundred
 pounds (£100) or thereabouts, as per charter
 party, that I may be enabled to settle up the
 many bills coming against the ship for ac-
 counting, outfit &c. This amount I would like to pay
 if convenient. As I understand Mr Jones is still
 absent & likely to be for the week I beg you
 will advise him of the probability of clearing
 the ship this week, especially of his presence in
 the cargo, or clearing the business, of which I, of
 course, do not know.
