upon the action of the court of appeal whether the  
 gentleman should and after judgment in the trial the  
 land in dispute will go to my favor. Mr. M. W. H. has  
 the gentleman's name in Baltimore by order of  
 the circuit court of Christian county, where the  
 judge must see the money they were entitled to for  
 the land and the money of the estate of the gentleman.  
 The gentleman due him a hundred dollars, paying the  
 part of the land tax. I would have been glad to  
 see the gentleman's papers, the money would be paid  
 to me. I expect the receipt they gave to Mr. M. W. H. for  
 the money for the land. The money Mr. M. W. H.  
 was to me to pay them in tobacco, or in other land.  
 They, being then free for their right and to the  
 land then in suit. As soon as the suit is decided  
 I presume Mr. M. W. H. will take the money, and  
 report to the court of appeal. It is made the  
 matter more sure by way of information, & have  
 written to Mr. Black of the gentleman by a lawyer &  
 made inquiry about the suit to the court, as it seems
