

Baltimore, Dec 12th 1860.

Friend Perry -

I have rec'd sundry letters from Mr
 Clark in regard to his papers in the ship, the last of
 which bears date of the 10th in which he says he is in Philad.
 awaiting his family, when they come, all will come direct
 to Balt. I take a cabin passage - On the 7th Mr
 Leavitt writes me a long letter in regard to the matter,
 in which many particulars are stated, wishing to know
 if we will take him - I have written Mr. Leavitt
 who was here & wrote him on the 9th Monday that
 we will take Charles & family any time, in cabin -
 I yesterday got a letter from Mr. Leavitt stating that Charles
 had decided to go in the Monday of the day written in
 which, among other reasons for going in the Monday
 he says. Mr. Perry & Dr. Dumbin would collect
 enough with the 50¢ to be given by the owners of
 the Monday to send him out in that vessel -

My impression was that you felt an anxiety that
 the ship should have passengers - even nominal
 passengers if nothing more. I have it seems you are
 busy in drawing up papers for the Monday that
 I had shipped, engaged for the ship & returned so in
 my order for Cabin Stairs. I believe that I feel quite
 as anxious for the success of the Monday concern, at least
 the colored journal, as yourself but would not wish
 the money business run for myself -
