Mr. Weston

Dear Sir. Enclosed to show your letter is specially directed in answer to you & I answer you here - but to little purpose as I know nothing about the arrangements to be made for the acceptance of services - & if I did do not see how either the Society or myself could interfere in effect the arrangements. Mr. Mallon has all to do here & probably Mr. Sigsbee & the Librarian look out there. & Mr. Mallon having your quiet as well as we do I fear him. It might mean then if my credit with any share of propriety advise him in the matter -
