

On Tuesday morning the 11th I had an appointment at Hobbs's School House in Anne Arundel County where at 10 o'clock, the hour of meeting, I found the door ~~was~~ locked and after waiting fifteen or twenty minutes I was favourably the presence of four persons.

It may be supposed to observe that all my labours for the last two or three weeks have been directed to the instruction of the Community white and coloured in the doctrines of Colonization; I see no cause to change an opinion expressed in my last report, that the A. B. C. of the system is yet to be imparted to nineteen twentieths of the population. All the congregations who have attended my address manifest a deep interest in the details which have been submitted, and judging from subsequent expressions I can but believe that the cause may be organized to almost any desirable extent. My future labours are in the lower and upper end of Anne Arundel for one week to come when further information may be expected.
