he will feel it to be his duty to retire from
the service of the Society from a deep conviction
that the means employed cannot produce
the amount of success which must be speedily
realized or the cause of Colonization abandoned.
In uttering this conclusion the agent believes that
the Board will concur with him in sentiment
that what is done for Colonization in Maryland
must be done quickly. And he is resolved to
adopt no half way measures when there
is such a tremendous interest at stake.
The responsibility of the failure shall not if by
any prudent means it may be prevented
be at the agents door, as it is for the Board
to say whether or not he shall be sustained.
