Res^d & Dear Sir

I duly received your favour of the 5th inst & thank you for your very kind & obliging expressions of regard. I hope the endeavours I have made to promote our common cause in the South West have not ^{been} wholly unsuccessful & I feel much confidence in the final triumph of the Colon Policy over all ignorance, prejudice, & opposition.

I am happy to say, that our Board think well of your project of building a vessel to run between Baltimore & our African Colonies, & in case your plan be carried into effect, our Society "will avail itself of the opportunities which it will afford, from time to time, of sending out Emigrants and supplies to its Colony, provided the terms for a passage and freight be such as shall be approved."

Having entire control of a ship, well suited to convey emigrants & supplies to your Colony will doubtless give you many advantages, & I have no doubt it ^{will} prove a great accommodation to us. I shall probably be in Baltimore
