

and the board conscious that their action in the premises will be just.

Capt. Rich. France owes to the Society on acct of the purchase of the mare he bought \$30, he having paid \$30 which I have accounted for.

There is due him by the Society about \$12 or \$13 for sundry passages to Plum Point for Hammond & one for myself & 1 month's pasture of horse. I gave him to the 1st January to pay it in. It is a good debt & he will pay it. I have disposed of both horses & accounted for them; they cost \$122, they brought 105, within 19 dollars of their first cost.

In addition to the \$1137.28 which I have collected, Dr. J. Dorsett's estate in St. Anne's county will remit to you \$50 a subscription of W. D. to the Packet, probate of which I made before the Register of Wills. When this is paid, there will have been collected through my instrumentality \$1187.28 in 10 months.
