

In this Quarter, I have travelled by Steamboat —	345	miles

My correspondence with the Society, indicates my business in this quarters travels. It was mostly special, and therefore irregular: not amounting to a systematic canvass. I shall open a practical campaign through the state, com'g at St Marys, the middle of April, for money & emigrants.

In respect to my collections for this quarter, I have got \$40 sub^s to the Packet, in 1841: In the city of Balt^o, in Jan^y navy, I obtained 9 new subscribers to the Society of \$5 each; got one to raise his subscription from \$5 to \$10; & got back 2 old sub^s of \$5. In 1846, the list of \$10 sub^s was 4; of \$5 57:— in 1847 the \$10 sub^s was 3, the \$5, 46; & in 1848, they had still decreased to 38 for the \$5's: the \$10's being 3.

In the month of January 1849, I brought up the \$10's to 4, and the \$5's to 45, having still left of the old subscribers 25. These I have laid aside, for the present: I am striving to force more new ones.
