late of Queen Anns County deceased.

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto James B Cooper my Negro
boy called Charles Newnam now four years old the sixth
day of April last to serve the said James B Cooper until
he arrives at the age of twenty years, after that time to be
free and discharged from the service of the said Cooper.
