

In the last Will and Testament of Rezin Bennett deceased, which bears date the twentieth day of December in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty four, and which was proven on the thirtieth day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and thirty five, among other expressions is the following, viz

"It is my will and desire that my negro man Jack"
"shall be free at my death in case he will leave this"
"State immediately and that my Executors pay him"
"Fifty dollars, but if he should neglect to leave this"
"State in three months from my death it is my will"
"and desire that he be a slave for life to my nephew"
"Samuel Bennett of Samuel"
