


To all whom it may concern, be it known, that I James Bartlett
Esq. of Talbot County in the State of Maryland, for conscience sake,
me therunto moving, have released from slavery, liberated manu-
mitted, and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery
liberate manumit and set free my negro slave named Cassar
Wandy, being of the age of Twenty four years and able to work
and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance and him the
said negro man named Cassar Wandy, I do declare to be
henceforth free, manumitted and discharged from all manner
of service or servitude to me, my executors or administrators forever.
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
this eighth day of the third month Eighteen hundred and forty three.
