" will that the said blackman Isaac Anderson be free at my death
" if not emanumated by me before. - It is my will and desire that
" if the Laws of our State should be such that the said black man
" Isaac Anderson could not hold the before mentioned goods, chattels
" land and tenements as before mentioned and devised that my Execu-
" tors hereinafter named shall give him all the moveable property as
" aforesaid forthwith and see that he is moved to the State of Pennsyl-
" -vania in safety with them and at the end of one year to pay to the
" said black man Isaac Anderson four hundred Dollars to be taken
" out of my personal Estate, but it is my desire that the former be done
" if possible and it is my will and desire that the said black man have
" and hold the said land and premises during his natural life and if he
" marries a free coloured woman and hath children, that it be to
" him, his heirs and assigns forever - if not that it be the right, title
" and estate of Thomas Turner my Nephew at his the said black
" man's death. I further will that the two black children that
" I have namely Jesse and Martha Eller be free at my death
" or when they are twenty two years old and have fifty dollars each
" out of my Real Estate to be paid by my Executor. - I further will
" unto my brother John B. Kidd and my brother Wilson Kidd's
" son Henry S. Kidd all the balance of my land to be equally
" divided between them share and share alike, provided that Henry
" S. Kidd pay to his father one hundred dollars and John B.
" Kidd pay unto the two black children each fifty dollars as aforesaid
" and see that they obtain their freedom at the age of twenty
