

Shirley engage to pay to Messrs. W. Howell
& Son, Ten days after they shall have
given satisfactory notice to the Board
of Managers of the Maryland State Colonization
Society, of the faithful performance
of the conditions of the Charter Party for
the schooner Harmony, Captain Percival
bound to Cape Palmas W. Africa, the
sum of six hundred dollars, less
the interest that may have accrued
on the sum of seven hundred
dollars advanced to them, as per
Charter party on the 27th of June
last past - Signed Luke Timmon
Baltimore
July 1. 1835.

W. Howland & Son by W. Whitney
this 2^d day of July. 1835

We hereby agree to bring from 40 to 45 and not
exceeding 45 Emigrants from Charleston to Baltimore
provided they are in Charleston from ^{the first to the}
fifth of May, and find them in ^{the ship} ~~the~~ ^{provisions} for the
sum of Three Hundred dollars on board the Brig
General Pinckney.
