

This Charter party of affreightment  
entered into this sixth day of July  
Eighteen hundred of thirty six between  
James I Corner acting for the owner  
of the Schooner Genancien of the burthen  
of sixty or seventy tons, or thereabouts,  
now lying in the Port of Baltimore,  
whereof Samuel Franklin is Master.  
And the Maryland State Colonization  
Society. Witnesseth that the said James  
I Corner, owner, hath this day letten  
said vessel to freight, & to the use  
there presents let her whole deck,  
burthen of appurtenances, exclusive  
of the cabin & such parts of the hold  
as may be necessary for the storage  
of the necessary rigging water & wood,  
to the Maryland State Colonization Society,  
for a voyage from Baltimore to Cape  
Palmas on the Western Coast of Africa,  
with Emigrants of cargo for the Colony  
of Maryland in Liberia. In consider-  
ation of which the Maryland State  
Colonization Society do hereby bind  
themselves to pay to the said James  
I Corner or his order the sum of  
Eight hundred Dollars, current money  
of the United States, to be paid on the
