

Know all by these presents that We the undersigned
Chiefs & Kings of Cape Palmas, Grande Sestos & Beddoe on the
West Coast of Africa do hereby by this Treaty made between
us & George Alexander Robertson, vice Governor to the King
of Englande alle our right and title of sovereignty & Royalty
of the territory, lands, Habourns, Coasts, Creeks, rivers, and
other public interests & alle & every ^{other} articles or things whatsoever
& whatsoever in & about this our Country, as they are held by
us in common, to have and to hold for the full use of the
British people and ourselves: so that we shall be considered
hereafter British Subjects & our lands so conveyed shall
become a part of the British Empire & that the British
Colonial Laws shall be exercised in full effect, & that such
decisions as may be made in case of dispute, by the com-
mon forms of British administration shall be definitive &
stand without appeals, to any forms of law, custom or
customs that may hereafter or shall at any time hereafter
be practised as means of attaining justice by us or
any of us. We further agree that the terms shall be on
the same conditions as that of Sierra Leone & that Europeans
shall live amongst us in fellowship & be allowed without
restriction alle the rights & privileges of possession & cultivation
or other advantages or industrious employments. We fully con-
sent that alle the lands or situations required for erecting
of Fortifications, barracks, hospitals or other public buildings or
to be applied to any public use or purpose shall be left unoccupied.
