SUBSCRIBED IN SINGLE DAY

Congregation Of Bethesda Methodist Protestant Church, Salisbury, Contributes \$86,660 For New Edifice.

Easton has become the commercial center of the county. On Sunday, the members of the Bethesda Methodist Protestant Church subscribed the phenomenal sum of \$86,660 to a fund for the building of the proposed new \$125,000 church, to take the place of the one in which the congregation now worships. This large sum was subscribed wholly by 196 members of that church, in amounts from \$1.00 to \$6000.00. A most interesting feature of the morning services was the impressive appeal of William E. Sheppard for co-operation, in building the new church. He has, for a great number of years taken an active and earnest interest in the work of the church and his sincerity and earnestness deeply impressed his auditors. Of the total amount subscribed, \$84,000 was taken at the morning session. Work on the new edifice, it is understood, will begin at an early day.

The great liberality, shown by the congregation of Bethesda, has evoked from the city's Ministerial Union, formal resolutions, conveying to this church's popular pastor and his flock, the warmest congratulations and the sincerest commendations. His hearty response made by his church to the appeal for funds to erect the new edifice, which the Union interprets as a "unique compliment" to Rev. Shipley.

These eulogistic resolutions, that have been passed with such spontaneous unanimity and regardless of denominational differences, by Salisbury's united clergy, will meet the approval of the people of this city. The spirit of broad-minded generosity, with which the Bethesda atmosphere was surcharged last Sunday, will be a lasting tribute to the congregation; to their unwavering faith alike to the highest interests of the church of their choice and to the community, which it serves with such signal fidelity. And it will be a tribute to the pastor, whose power of personality was one of the most potent influences, through which this wonderful result was realized.—Advertiser.


