TO CONDUCT CAMP FOR BOYS AT TOLCHESTER

About 40 Local Youngsters Will Be Taken To Camp Fairlee August 1 to 10—Athletics, Water Sports, Etc. Will Be Features Of The Splendid Outing.

Camp Fairlee, ho! About forty young members of Salisbury's Young Men's Christian Association and Boy Scouts will go to camp for ten days in August, arrangements having been made by the "Y" officials to take the boys to Kent county for a splendid outing. The camp will be located about two miles north of Tolchester Beach and its name is Camp Fairlee.

Physical Director W. L. Borgs, of the local "Y", will have charge of the camp, and will be assisted by Prof. R. Lee Clarke and E. Sheldon Jones. The boys will leave Salisbury at 11 a. m. Monday, August 1, on the steamer Victor Lynn, and will arrive at Tolchester Beach the following morning around 5 o'clock. The return trip will be made Wednesday, August 10, at 6 p. m.

Camp Fairlee is ideally situated on a bluff overlooking the Chesapeake Bay and is accessible by good roads and by boat. It boasts of one of the finest bathing beaches along the bay, and nearby fishing grounds help make the place an especially attractive spot for camping parties. The buildings and tents are all on high ground overlooking the bay, the water supply is absolutely pure, and the surrounding locality is healthful and safe.

Will Teach Boys To Swim. The total cost of the camp, including transportation, will be \$8.50, and it is stated that this sum must be paid in advance. Nature study and athletics will be a feature of Camp Fairlee. There will be organized baseball leagues, track meets, volley ball contests, as well as a variety of impromptu games of all kinds. Each day will be brought to a close with a camp fire on the beach, around which tales will be told and songs will be sung. Boys will be taught to swim in a short time by experts, but every precaution will be observed to govern the water activities of the youngsters. The water will be paroled at regular bathing periods, and all boys will be subject to regulations which make accidents next to impossible. No boy will be permitted to go into the water except during the regular bathing periods. The daily water schedule for the youngsters follows: 7:00 a. m.—regular morning swim; 11:15 a. m.—regular evening swim; 4:15 p. m.—regular evening swim.

The "Y" authorities will have five strict regulations governing the camp which each boy must closely observe. They follow: First—no swimming except at appointed times with life-savers in charge; second—no smoking while connected with the camp; third—no fire arms; fourth—positively no leaving camp grounds without permission; fifth—a gentleman always.

Interment was made in Forrest Cemetery.

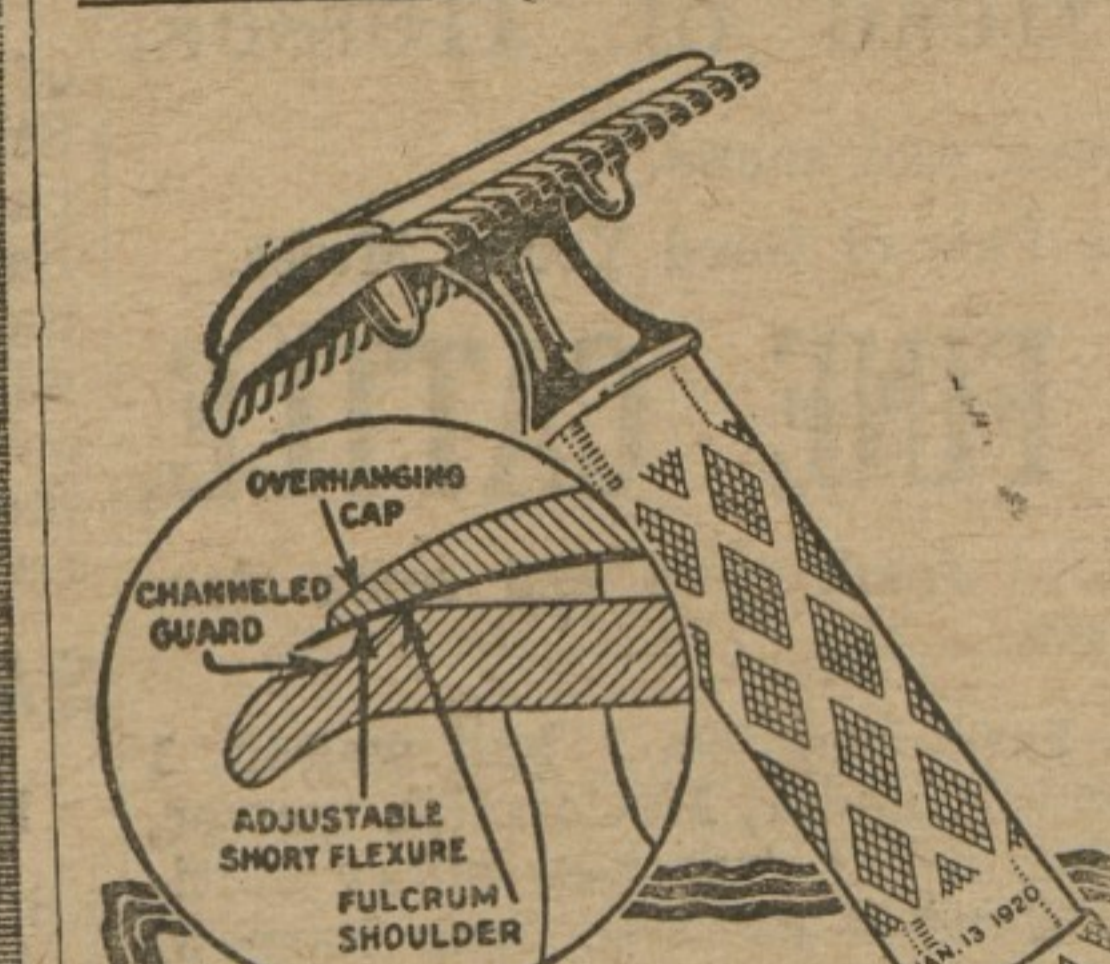
