LAWYER WITH PISTOL MARCHES HIM TO CELL

The tables were turned on B. Chambers Wickes, son of Pere L. Wickes, well-known lawyer, when he marched George Frank, 224 St. Paul street, to Central Police Station at the point of a pistol and ordered his arrest on a charge of threatening him. Policeman Kaufman also arrested Wickes on a charge of having a weapon. In Central Police Court Justice Demarco dismissed Frank and fined Wickes \$11.45.

According to the testimony Frank, who has only one arm, and Wickes quarreled over some girl friends. Frank is employed by a tailor at the St. Paul street address. Monday while delivering a suit of clothes he passed Wickes' home, 920 St. Paul street. Wickes said he was on his front steps and that Frank threatened to shoot him. For that reason he procured the revolver and made Frank march to the station house.

The Civil Service Commission named August 13 as the date for holding examinations to fill postmastership vacancies at nine Maryland offices of the third class. Examinations will be held on that date to designate eligibles for appointment at Betterton, Forest Glen, Harlock, La Plata, Ocean City, Perryman, Port Deposit, Reisterstown and White Hall. The Betterton office pays \$1,300 annually; Perryman, \$1,100; White Hall, \$1,400; Forest Glen, \$2,000, and La Plata, \$1,800. The remainder pay \$1,900 annually. Examinations for any one of the above named third-class offices will be conducted at Baltimore, Berlin, Chestertown, Federalsburg, and applicants may apply at the nearest of these offices.

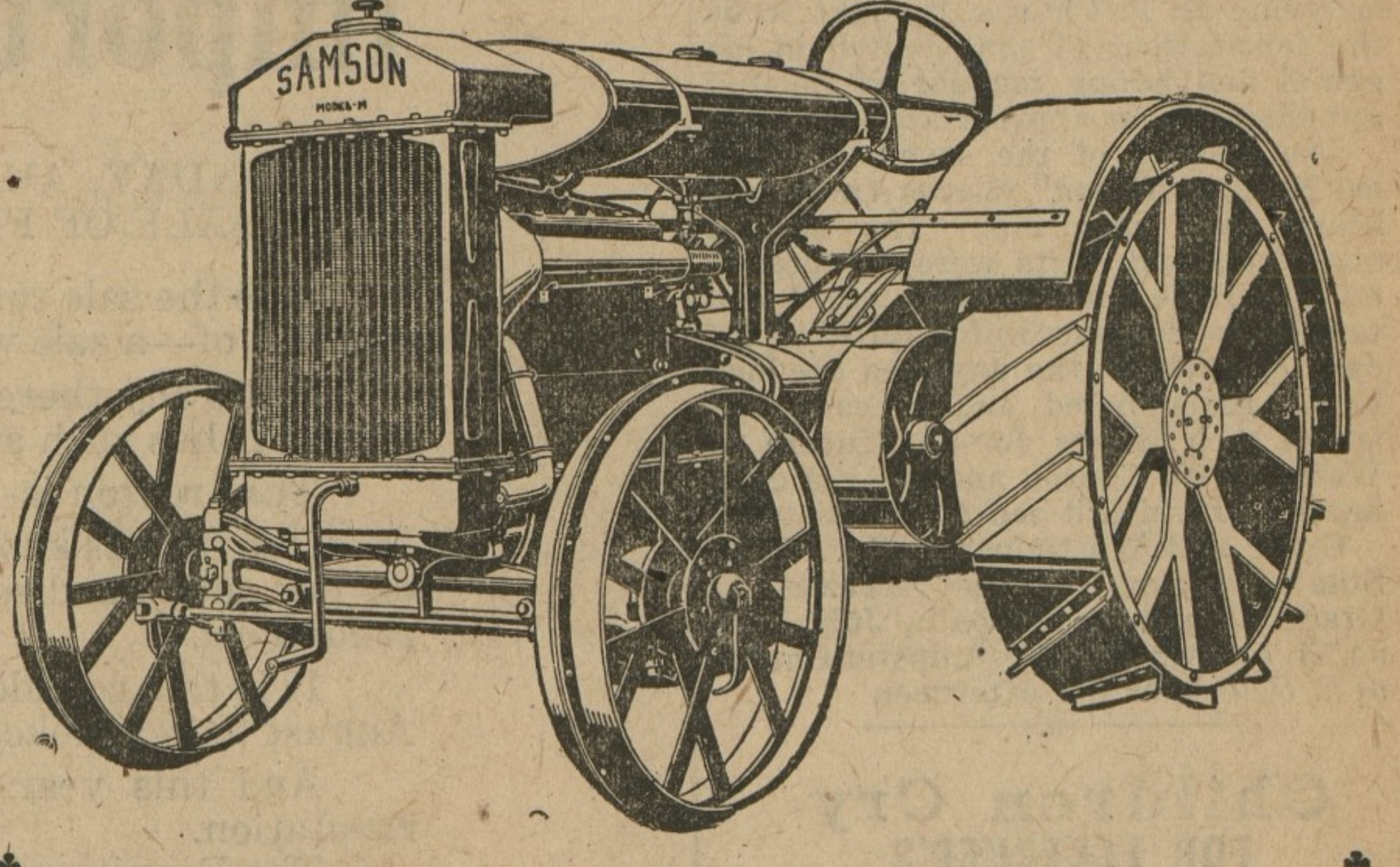
