AUTO FOR EVERY 9. Less Accidents On Eastern Shore Than Any Part Of The State.

According to the records kept by the assistant engineer of the State Roads Commission, the 600 miles of roads on the Eastern Shore are far safer and freer from accidents than the 1,100 miles on the Western Shore. Ninety accidents are shown on his map since May 1. Of these only 14 have occurred on the roads of the Eastern Shore, while 76 are credited to the Western Shore. Of the accidents on the Eastern Shore but one resulted fatally, while the Western Shore shows 17 deaths. The statistics also show that most of the accidents occur on long, straight stretches of road, proving the contention that these are more dangerous than the curves because the temptation to speed on a long straightway is too great for the auto driver to resist, and speed always brings danger. An interesting conclusion is made by this article. In speaking of the number of automobiles owned in the State, the Eastern Shore is credited with a larger per cent of the population, and Easton is believed to have one automobile for every nine of its inhabitants. This seems to be a pretty high figure when one looks at it, but there are certainly a good many automobiles owned in this city and in the county.—Star-Democrat.
