**NOTICE TO DAIRYMEN**

The work of the U. S. Bureau of Animal Industry, in tuberculosis eradication in the dairy herds of Kent and Queen Anne's counties, has progressed very satisfactorily within the last three weeks, about forty herds having been tested by the Federal Veterinarian. Furthermore there are many dairymen who are anxious to have their herds tested as soon as possible. Unfortunately, the State of Maryland Department of Agriculture is running short of its funds which to meet its share of the indemnity which is paid to farmers on cows reacting to the test. The work in Kent and Queen Anne's counties will therefore have to cease temporarily until the next State appropriation. This is unfortunate in view of the fact that the Federal appropriation is probably large enough to cover the Governments share of the indemnity for the coming year.

It should be understood that the co-operative tuberculosis eradication plan, means that the Federal government will only pay indemnity equal in amount to what the State is able to pay. Therefore as the State funds are running low with which to meet their share of indemnities, the work must either slow down or cease altogether until next State appropriation.

If you are interested in tuberculosis eradication, and want to be sure that the State funds will soon be available to continue the work, you will do well to bring whatever influence you have to bear on your State representative, to insure adequate appropriation to cover the State's share of the indemnity. The services of a Federal Veterinarian in Kent and Queen counties, will most likely not be available again, for regular clean up work until this appropriation goes thru.
