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CHURCH SERVICES FOR ARMISTICE DAY URGED

A movement to have all churches of the country open one hour on the morning of Armistice Day, November 11, for appropriate service to crystallize public opinion in support of the disarmament conference which will convene in Washington that day, has been started by the National League of Women Voters.
Miss Elizabeth J. Hauser, of Girard, Ohio, chairman of the committee on disarmament of the League, sent a letter to President Harding, urging him to issue a formal call to the churches to co-operate in the solemn public demonstration. Letters also were sent to all women's national organizations inviting their co-operation.

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
