THE CONTEST BEGINS

As we go to press the Democratic Primaries are being held. Full returns may be had by any reader by calling No. 4. There was a small vote, evidently little interest in the three contests. There has been nothing done to interfere with the election of the Democratic ticket this fall, all the contestants being satisfied that they had an equal chance and feeling it to be their duty to work for the success of the nominees.

A SOUND AND SANE GOVERNMENTAL PLAN

A clearer, more logical, more unswerving State paper than the report of the subcommittee of the commission named by Governor Ritchie to prepare a plan for the reorganization of the State's system of government has not been presented in Maryland in a long while. It is recognized that, while the views of the members of the committee are those in the report, the actual work has been done by the Governor and the report is really his handiwork. The thing that sets the Maryland plan of reorganization out as unique in the country is that, while in Ohio and other States the work has been done by experts employed for the purpose, here the job has been done by the Governor himself. This is the one State in which the man elected by the people has really done the work.

The Governor and the committee started out with the idea that no plan of reorganization, no matter how efficient, would be worth while unless it also showed a saving of money to the taxpayers. Their plan fully meets this test. An obvious saving of \$145,000 annually in salaries of unnecessary officeholders is effected by the plan. This amount will be only a small part of the actual saving. The real economies will come in the greater efficiency and the better methods of handling the State's money and the State's business. A conservative estimate places the total saving at half a million dollars yearly and it may run a great deal more. The plan is sound, sane and sensible, and if the Democratic party in its State Convention pledges itself to its enactment, it will go a long way toward justifying its continued control of State affairs.—Sun.

SAYS PEOPLE GOT WHAT THEY WANTED

When the American people, including the great body of workers, voted the present administration into office they got exactly what they decided they wanted, Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, Monday told a tremendous crowd gathered at River View Park for the Labor Day celebration.

"A year ago there was scarcely a handful of men in this great country out of employment. Now there are more than five millions out of work. In Baltimore alone there are nearly 2,500 more men out of work to-day than there were last month, and Baltimore is one of the cities in which unemployment is marked. Who will you blame for this condition? Will you blame the shadowy, indefinite thing of which you know nothing, or will you hold responsible those who are in commercial, industrial and political control of our country?"
