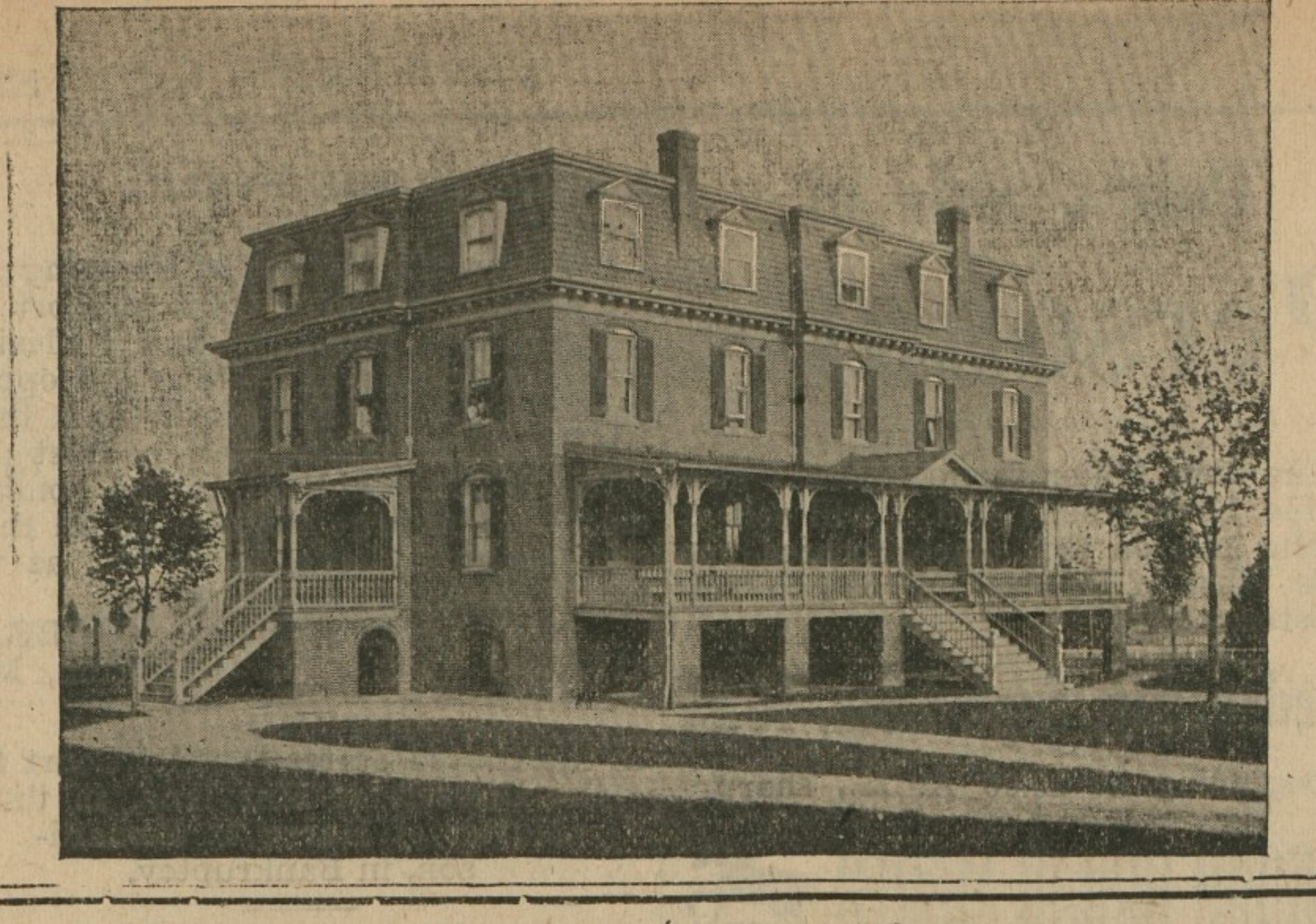

WASHINGTON COLLEGE WILL OPEN FOR THE FALL TERM SEPT. 19, 1921.

Will Add a Business Course to the Schedule.

THE WOMEN'S DORMITORY RE-OPENED

Co-education has become the accepted method of college education. The few colleges that still accept men only are already an anachronism, and the purely women's colleges merely demonstrate female conservatism. The newer colleges are almost without exception co-educational, and the famous old institutions like Harvard and Columbia have in most cases colleges for women associated with them. Even the conservative University of Virginia has at last opened its doors to women. This is as it should be. Men and women must live in the world together; and any education gained in artificial surroundings with one sex excluded will necessarily be untrue to life, and will surely play its possessive false.

There is an impression that Washington College ran against the tide and excluded women just when other colleges were becoming co-educational. This is not quite true. Previous to 1910 Washington College conducted a Normal Department, the students of which were mostly women. There was a women's dormitory accommodating about forty students. In 1910 the Normal Department was discontinued, and the women's dormitory was closed. Since then there have always been women students in the college, but there has been no dormitory for them. The college has never ceased to be co-educational. It has only ceased to provide for the housing of women students.

Fortunately, conditions are now such that the women's dormitory can now be reopened. Among girls the proportion of high school graduates who attend college is annually increasing. That fact creates sufficient demand for college facilities to justify Washington College in meeting the demand. Moreover, the new commercial department here offers an opportunity for girls to get a commercial training under much better conditions than they have been able to find in the past, and undoubtedly a large number of young women will come here rather than go to a city for their commercial work. These two conditions will guarantee Washington College a large attendance of women in the near future. The dormitory for women will be reopened this year. The building has fallen into bad order during several

TO DISABLED SOLDIERS.

The Veterans Bureau created by the passage of the Sweet bill, approved August 9th, 1921, consolidates the activities of the former War Risk Bureau, Federal Board for Vocational Training and the U. S. Public Health and the Government to handle all claims of disabled veterans with no delay and the elimination of all unnecessary red tape.

The squad will visit Kent county on the 28th and 29th of this month and American Legion Post, Eastern Shore Inn, Chestertown, from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m., each day. The squad will arrive in Chestertown on the evening of the 27th, Tuesday, in time for a public meeting at the Legion Headquarters, Eastern Shore Inn, at 8 o'clock. A large attendance is expected as the purpose and object of the visit will be fully explained by several speakers well versed in the work. This squad looks for the hearty co-operation of everyone in Kent county, all civic and military organizations to dig up and unearth every disabled veteran whose war claims or rights have not been presented or have not been properly handled.

Send names of disabled soldiers to J. Thomas Kibler, Post Commander, American Legion, Chestertown, Md., and immediate action will be taken by the squad at the time of its visit. In the matter of lapsed or cancelled Government Insurance see the insurance expert with the squad and he will tell you how easy it is under new regulations to have your insurance restored and why it is your duty to yourself and dependents to keep this insurance alive.

Mr. Louis M. Kines, publicity manager, visited Chestertown the early part of the week and left nothing undone in the way of public notice, to bring the claims of disabled soldiers to the attention of everyone in the county.
