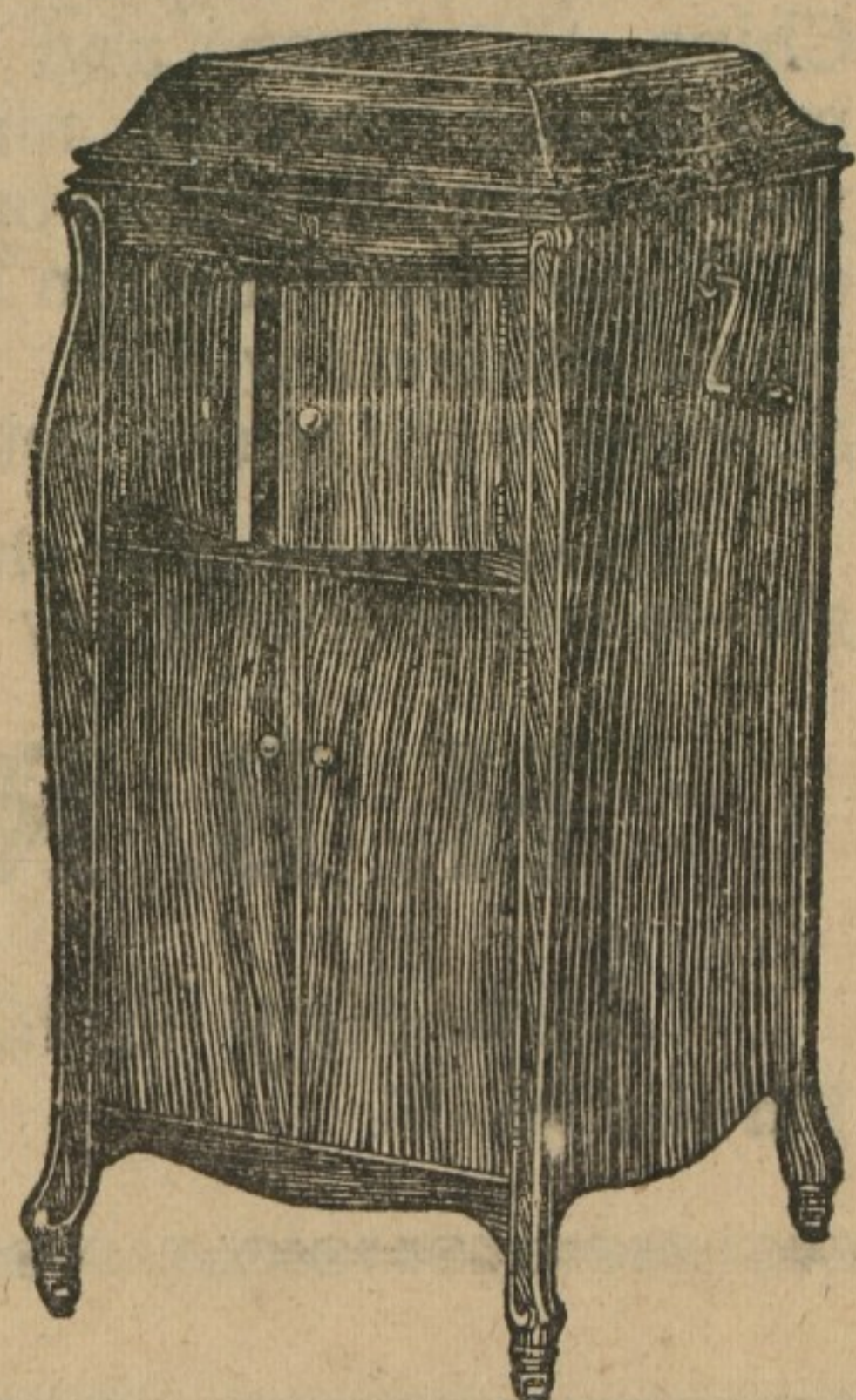

RUTH SUSPENDED BY JUDGE LANDIS

The "bad news" for Babe Ruth, world's champion home run hitter with the New York Yankees broke Monday. Ruth was fined his world's series prize, amounting to \$3,362.26, and suspended until May 20 of the 1922 season by Judge Landis, commissioner of baseball, for participating in those exhibition games following the close of the world's series games between the Giants and Yankees. Outfielder Bob Meusel and Pitcher William Fiercy, also members of the pennant-winning Yankees, who participated in the barnstorming trip with Ruth, drew substantially the same penalty. Fiercy's fine was \$100 less than the other two players—Fiercy's share of the world's series being that much less than the other players received. The decision punishing Ruth and the other players, which, in the baseball world, rests as the most important Judge Landis has made since he became commissioner, was made after two months' deliberation. After the players gave up their tour, Judge Landis sent each a questionnaire, ask-

ing their reasons for violating the rules of organized baseball. The rule, enacted in 1911, forbids a member of a team competing in the world's series championship, from participating in any exhibition games after the close of the series. Ruth replied to the questionnaire, but neither of the others answered it.

Judge Landis, in his decision, said the offending players "willfully and defiantly" violated the rules and that the situation involved not merely rule violation, "but rather a malicious defiance intended by the players to present this question: Which is the bigger—baseball or any individual in baseball?"

NEW M. P. CHURCH WILL COST \$75,000

William D. Haddock & Co., Monday afternoon, contracted to erect the Peninsula Methodist Protestant Church, which will be situated at the northeast corner of Washington and Twentieth streets, Wilmington. It will be of Greek Gothic architecture and built of stone. Bids were received and considered

at a meeting held in the Old Colony Club. The Peninsula Church Extension Society, the Maryland Conference committee, the Wilmington citizens committee and the local church committee were present, and President Sheridan of the Maryland Conference presided.

Three bids were received, and the lowest was accepted. The bid of William D. Haddock & Co. ranged from \$74,000 to \$75,000, according to the stone selected, and \$1,000 for bonding will make the probable contract price \$76,000. Port Deposit, Mt. Airy and Holmsburg granite will be submitted for choice. Erection of the building will begin after certain details have been worked out.
