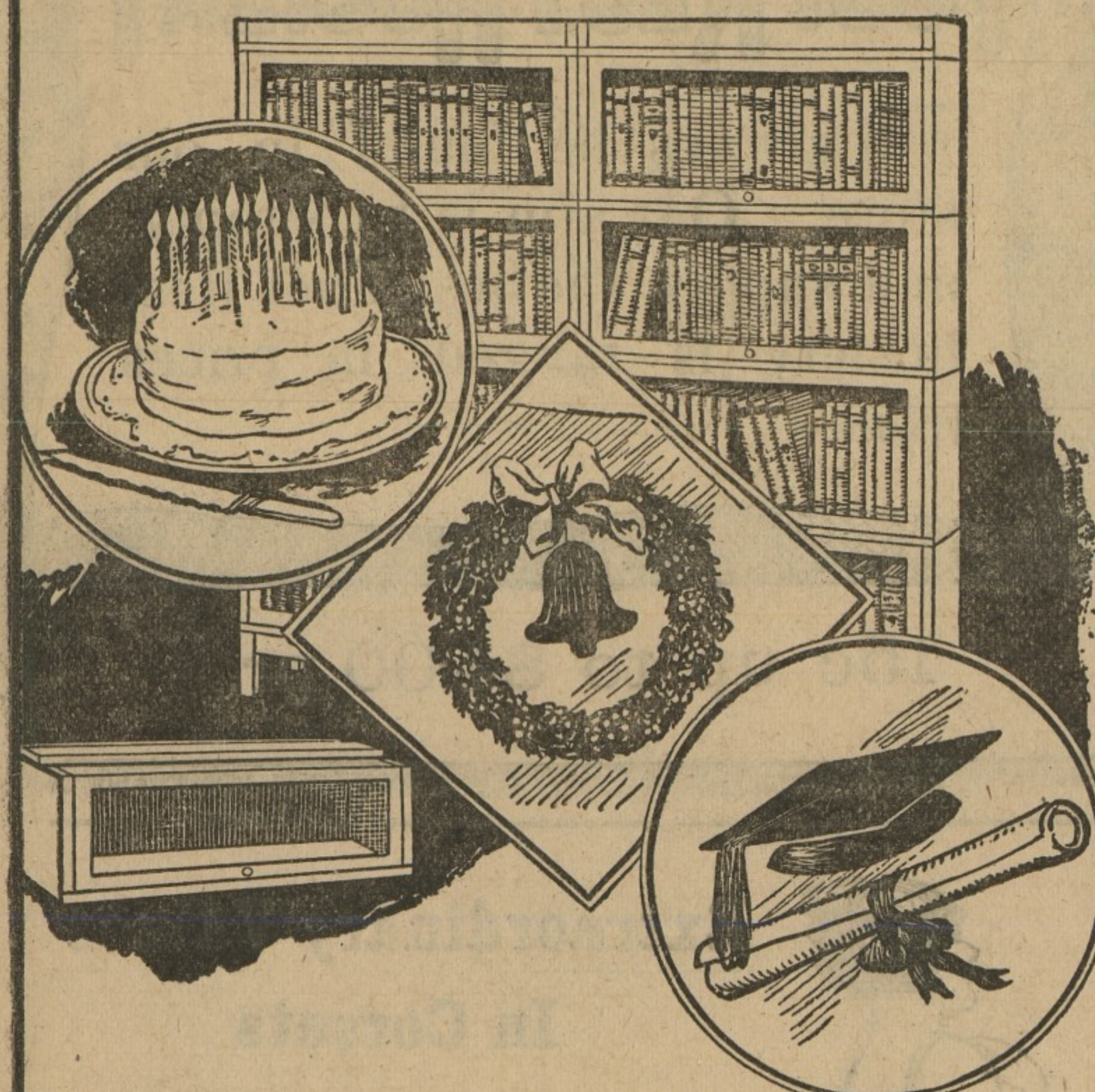

WAR RISK INSURANCE.

By the enactment of legislation creating the U. S. Veterans' Bureau, signed by the President of the United States on August 11, 1921, certain amendments were made to the War Risk Insurance Act, which are of vital interest to every ex-service man.

A special provision was made for the reinstatement and conversion of insurance policies which have been allowed to lapse. It was stipulated, however, that all insurance must be reinstated prior to January 1, 1922.

In view of the short period of time remaining for the Veterans to take advantage of this legislation, the bureau is inaugurating a campaign to assist every ex-service man who so desires to reinstate his insurance. The bureau therefore solicits your co-operation, and respectfully requests that you assist it by giving this matter all publicity possible to the end that every veteran interested may be reached.
