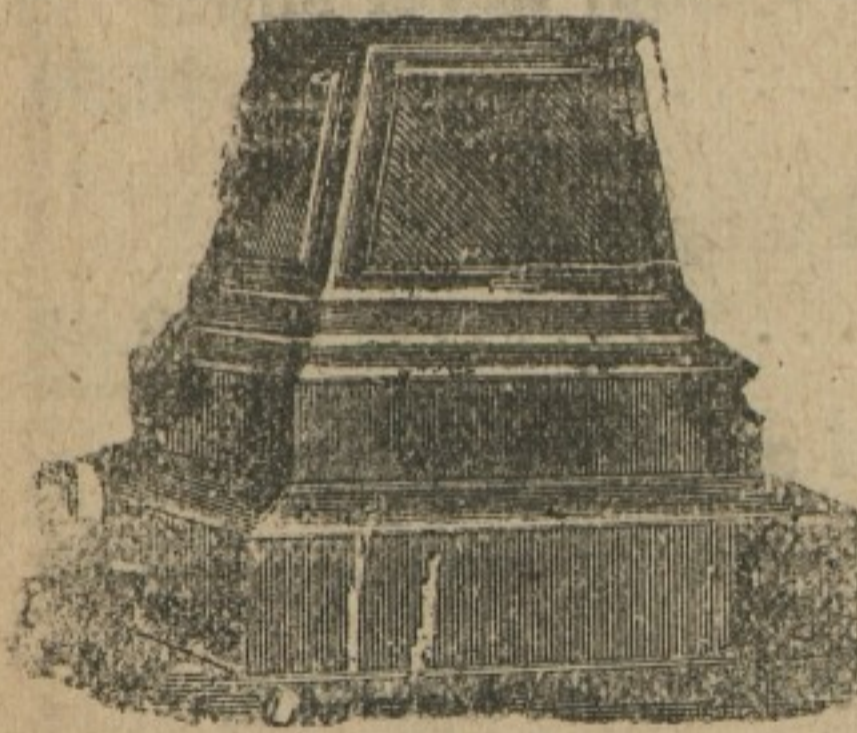

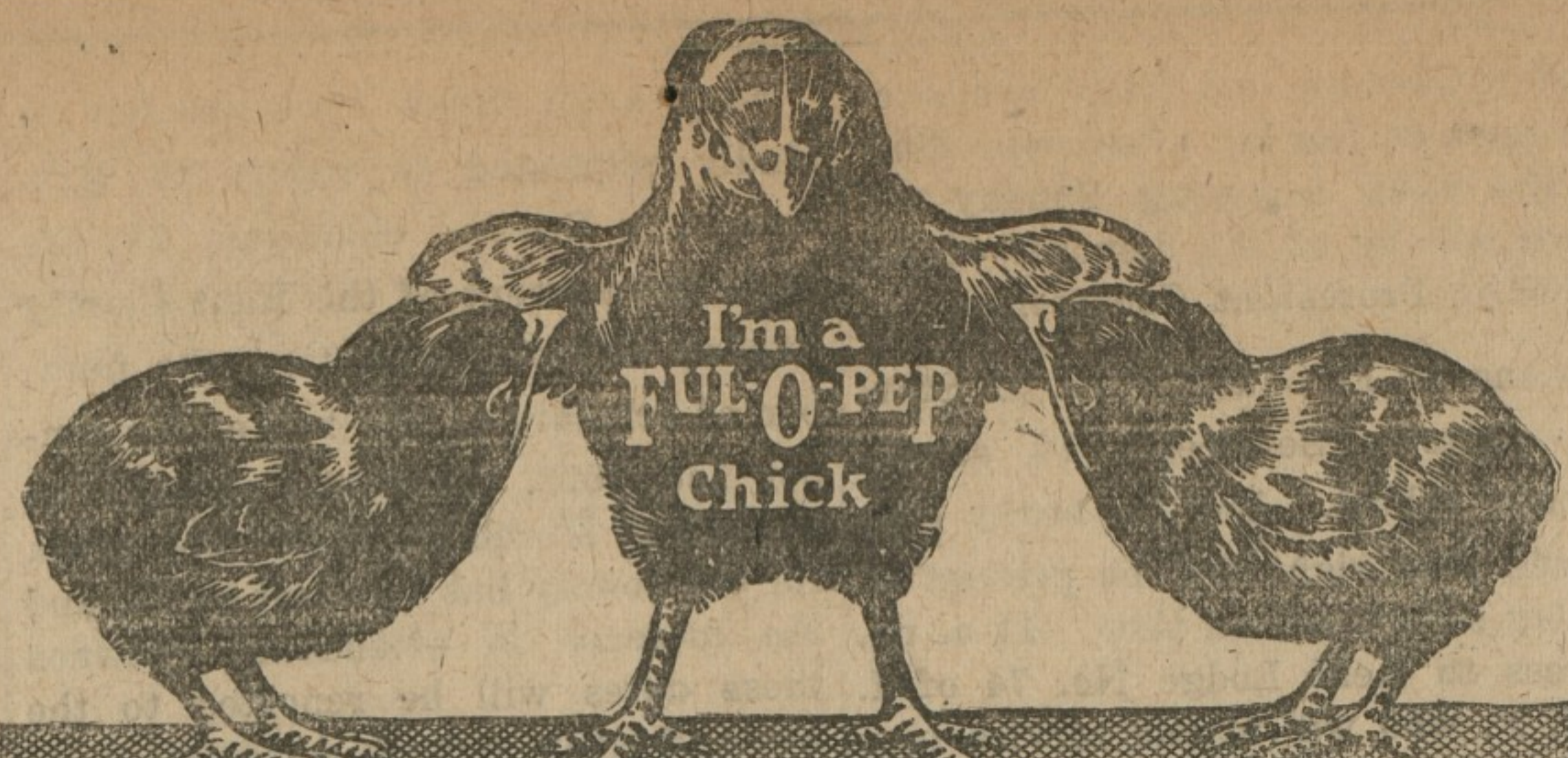

A Business Statement A Human Document.

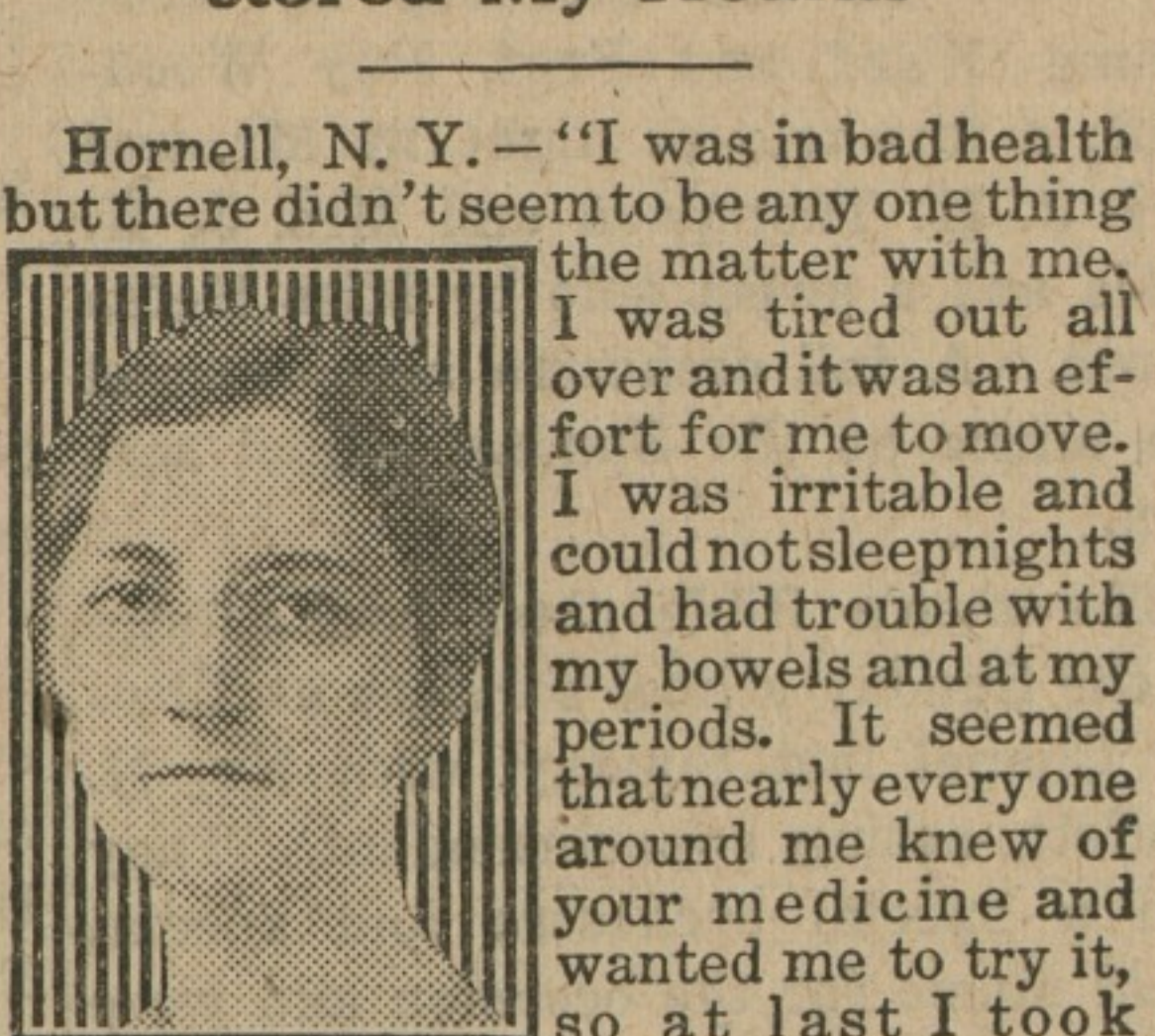

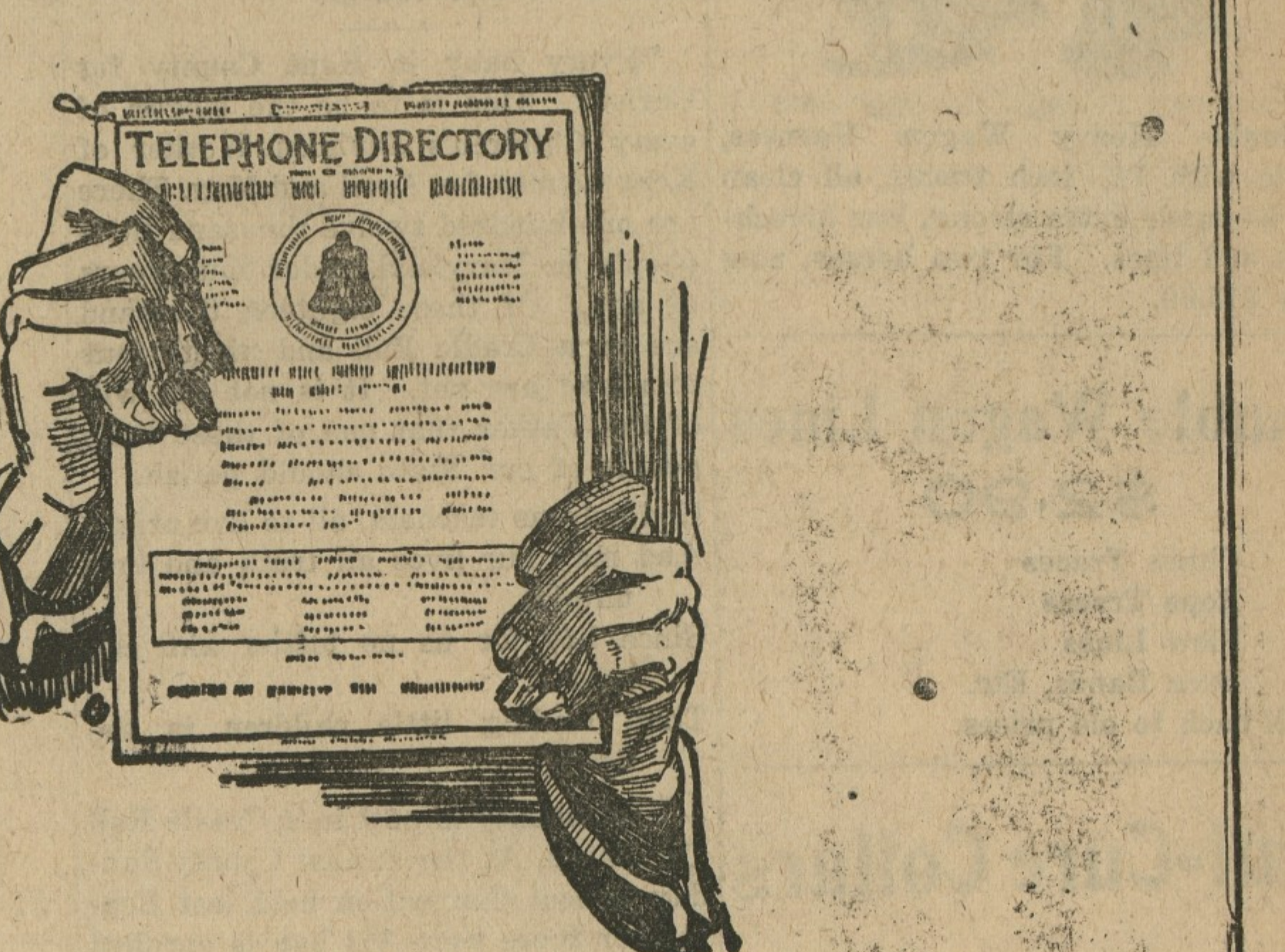
