PARSONS ISLAND

Located in Eastern Bay, Postoffice
Chestertown—Great Place For Wild
Game—Oysters and Fish in Abun-
dant—Tenanted By A Kent Coun-
tyman.

One of the greatest places for wild
game of all kinds besides the centre
of the fish, crab and oyster supply, is
Parsons Island tenanted by John F.
Usilton, of Kent county. The Island
contains 150 acres and surrounded by
the waters of Eastern Bay. It is a
five minutes trip from the main land
and mail is received at Chester on
Kent Island. The farm contains 4,000
peach and apple trees and is also a
great place for raising hogs, no cholera
having been known there.

The tenant married Miss Ashley,
of Rock Hall, has five children who are
healthy and lovers of the water. Mr.
Usilton previous to removing to Par-
sons Island lived on Poole's Island and
loves the isolation.

There are over 10,000 bushels of
oysters caught in the neighborhood
and loaded off the Island's shores. In
an interview with the tenant he says,
"At this time we are catching abundance
of fine fish, rock and perch, with
in a hundred yards of our house, and
throughout the season we have an
abundance of soft and hard crabs. The
island affords the finest sport of wild
game shooting, having the reputation
of breaking all records this past season
for wild duck shooting, over 4000
Canvas Back, Mallard, Black Head
and Red Heads having been shot from
the shore blinds. During one particu-
lar day from 7 o'clock in the morning
until 11 o'clock there were 400 ducks
shot from the wing. Many wild geese
afford fine sport. The island and sur-
rounding shores afford over 10 miles
of feeding grounds with many acres of
water front.

The island will take the prize for
fruit growing in all branches as the
location and soil is what makes it
famous for fruit growing. A valuable
substance for fertilizer of the island
and its soil are found on the shores
of the island. He has over 50 tons
already prepared for growing crops
this year on the island. The island
has one of the most ideal sand
beaches for bathing to be found throu-
out this country. The island is owned
by H. F. French, Esq., of Baltimore,
Secretary of the Board of Trade, and
is estimated to be worth \$58,000.

GRASSY MILK REJECTED

The grassy and garlicky milk situa-
tion at the cooling stations in Kent
has already assumed serious propor-
tions.

A representative of the Philadel-
phia Inter-State Dairy Council visited
the cooling station and carefully
inspected all the milk delivered by
farmers and a large quantity was re-
jected as being distinctly grassy or
garlicky in flavor. Those patrons
whose milk was very bad in this re-
spect were all listed. Each of these
has been sent a letter from the Inter-
state Dairy Council calling their at-
tention to this and suggesting ways
in which it could be remedied. When a
farmer's milk is found to be objection-
able in this respect he is sent a letter
or warning with suggestions for
remedying this condition. If the same
farmer, after being notified and hav-
ing had sufficient opportunity to put
these remedial measures into practice,
is found to be delivering grassy or
garlicky milk a second time, he will be
suspended for a period of several
weeks or a month before he will be
allowed to bring milk to the cooling
station again. This, of course, would
be a serious matter to farmers so
affected, since right at this time milk
is a very valuable farm product in
Kent county. On the other hand, any
one can understand that no dealer can
be expected to accept milk which,
when delivered to consumers in Phil-
adelphia, will be rejected by them on
account of its grassy and garlicky
flavor. This is a matter which can
only be handled by the closest whole-
hearted co-operation on the part of
every patron taking milk to a cooling
station.

The means recommended for elimi-
nating these flavors and odors from
milk are to turn the cows on pasture
gradually, say, for only a couple of
hours at first, and gradually lengthen
this pasture period as the season ad-
vances. If this is done and a feed of
dry roughage and grain mixture given
as long before milking time as pos-
sible very little or no trouble will be
experienced.

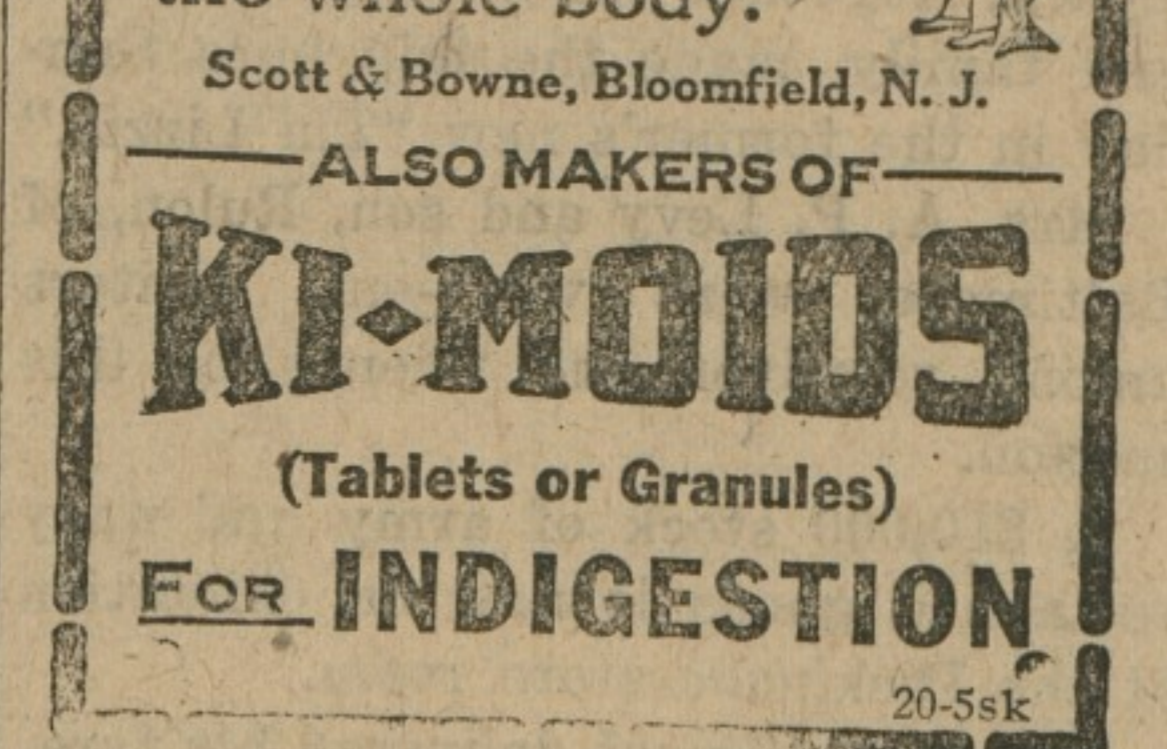
