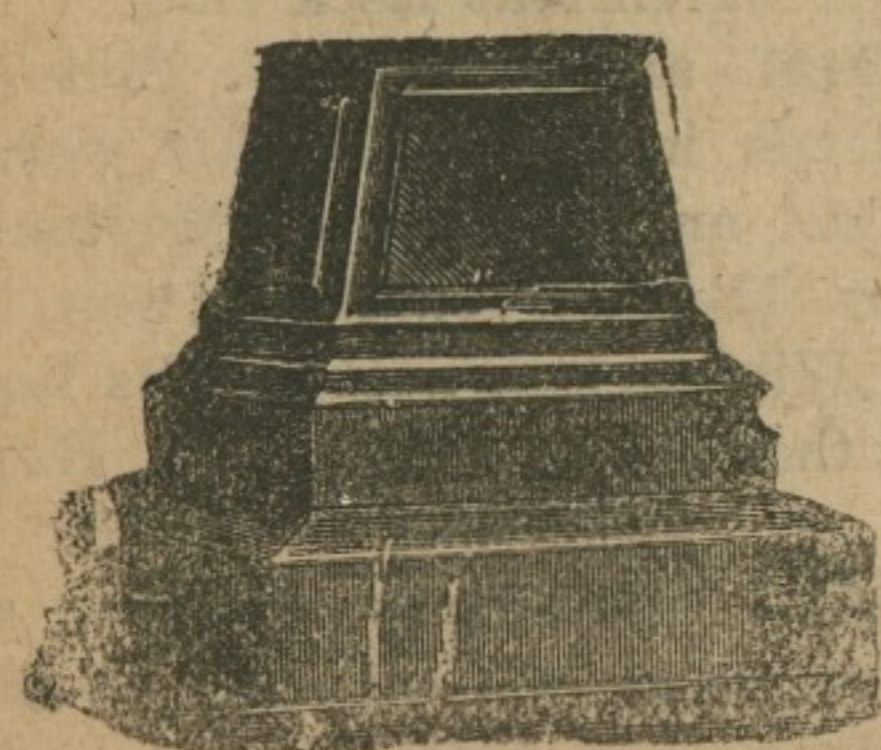

BIG FIRE IN POCOMOKE CITY

Damage From Blaze Put At \$500,000 To \$1,000,000—Ten Blocks Swept—National Guardsmen Are Sent From Salisbury To Prevent Looting Of Ruins.

About 10 blocks of Pocomoke City, including most of the business zone and 50 homes, were swept Monday by the biggest fire that has visited the Eastern Shore of Maryland in years. Starting in the stable of Frank M. Wilson, on Maple street, about noon, the blaze, fanned by a high wind, swept everything before it, defying efforts of local firemen and citizen volunteers, as well as fire companies summoned from points as far as Seaford, Del. Not until 4 o'clock was the blaze checked, and then only after it had laid in ruins an area which extended from Second street to the Pocomoke river front and from Maple street to Goode.
